The Learning objective is: To add es to words ending in -Ch, -S, -Sh, -X, -Z

This spelling rule has been identified as a rule that children need to recap. If your child is secure with this spelling rule please encourage them to complete the extension task.

If a noun ends in an 's', 'sh', 'ch' or 'x' then you just add an 'es' to the end of the word. A useful way to remember this, is that words ending with a 'hissing', 'buzzing' or 'whooshing' sound end in an 'es' when they become plural.
