Policy

School Uniform

Principles

Each child learns best when they are in a secure and safe environment that they enjoy coming to and where they feel they belong. The wearing of a school's uniform enhances a healthy sense of identity, community and belonging. With the name 'Holy Trinity', the school uniform enhances the Christian ethos of the school, by including the symbol of the Trinity of God.

Aims

- That each child wears the school uniform of the school the belong to (Holy Trinity Church of England Junior School) which is listed in Appendix I
- That each child is treated equally regardless of race, gender disability or other protected characteristics, in wearing the school uniform and being included in the school community.
- That all children dress as smartly as possible, bringing a sense of pride and belonging to themselves and to the school.

Practice

- The expectations of the school uniform are included in the school's introduction when parents first show an interest in the school.
- Whilst we encourage our children to wear the fleece, sweatshirt and tee-shirts
 which incorporate the name of the school and the symbol of the Holy Trinity, we
 also point out that children may wear tee-shirts, polo shirts, sweatshirts and
 cardigans that are red, without the symbol.
- Parents are informed of where they may purchase the school's uniform which incorporates the school symbol.
- Boys and girls alike may wear trousers, shorts and skirts.
- School uniform which has not been claimed in Lost Property is washed and sold each week as good quality second hand uniform.
- A store of good quality second hand uniform is kept at the school office and parents
 are made aware via the newsletter that if they need to renew uniform they may do
 so on a weekly basis.
- Children are encouraged and praised for wearing their uniform smartly
- They come to school in their uniform, change for PE and change back from their PE kit.
- Children wear shoes to and from school, and are allowed to change in to trainers at lunch time only.
- Children who request to wear their uniform in a way that reflects their religion, e.g. a head scarf, are accommodated by allowing this in the school colours and within health and safety regulations. Faces must be clearly seen.
- When children do not wear school uniform correctly, they are asked discretely to
- When a child does not wear school uniform correctly consistently, teachers will discuss the issue with the children's parents.
- Children are not punished in any way for incorrect school uniform. Where they are wearing something that is not considered to be safe for themselves or others,

- children will be asked to remove the item which is causing the health and safety problem.
- Where a child has a protected characteristic which requires that school uniform is altered in some way, this is discussed with the head teacher and a reasonable agreement is reached.
- All uniform **must** be named.

Monitoring and evaluation

It is the duty of the head teacher, the full governing body and all staff to carry out the school uniform policy fairly and without prejudice. Any issues regarding school uniform are reported to the Pupils' and Curriculum Committee of the governing body by the head teacher each term.

Appendix I

Holy Trinity Church of England Junior School Uniform

School Uniform 9.11.23

School uniform helps to create a school identity, as well as a sense of belonging and pride. The uniform consists of:

- White shirt or blouse, or a white polo shirt (collar and three buttons);
- Grey or black trousers, skirt or pinafore
- Red fleece, cardigan or sweatshirt with or without the school logo
- Grey, white or black socks or tights
- Footwear must be completely black, sensible, practical, comfortable, safe (i.e. no high heels, or backless shoes; trainers are only for PE & games).
- In the summer, red gingham dresses may be worn
- Long hair should be tied back, with small, plain accessories, preferably matching the school uniform

Cladish of Wallington stock items designed for our school, e.g. sweatshirts, fleeces, cardigans and polo shirts. They also stock red T shirts with the school logo that are optional for PE but are good if your child is likely to take part in team sport events. Most other items can be bought from many High Street stores. There is very good quality second hand uniform is available every Wednesday in school at the beginning and end of the day in the office. Please make good use of this.

Art/D.T. kit An overall or an old shirt to protect your child's clothing is advised.

P.E. kit

Children come to school wearing their P.E. kit on their timetabled P.E. days.

Indoor - white or red t-shirt, plain black shorts and plimsolls (or bare feet)



Outdoors - same as for indoor PE with trainers/plimsolls and unbranded, dark tracksuits (without hoodies) in cold weather

Swimming - Swimsuits/trunks (no Bermuda shorts), swim hat, towel

Any P.E. kit required in school should be kept safely in a clearly marked, drawstring bag. We have spare clothing if required to ensure children do not miss any lessons.

Jewellery is not allowed in school except stud earrings and watches.

ALL ITEMS MUST BE CLEARLY MARKED WITH THE CHILD'S NAME

Any unmarked property will be placed in the lost property area near the hall. Two Year 6 prefects attempt to return items to their owners, but it is the owner's responsibility to relocate their belongings. At the end of each term, un-named, un-claimed, quality uniform will be recycled.

Lost property is put outside the front of the school each day, so that parents can support children to find any items that might be lost.
