

Enrichment clubs FAQs

- Do clubs run by external providers cost the same as those run by the school?

No, the school run clubs are cheaper. External providers offer expertise and equipment that can not necessarily be provided by the school

- Why do club prices fluctuate from term to term?

Prices are set as a per week price by the school and external providers. The cost will fluctuate due to differing term lengths. The school will keep the clubs to 10 weeks maximum.

- Why does the school restrict numbers for clubs?

Places are allocated based on the number of staff running the club to keep adult to child ratios safe. Additional adults may be available to increase numbers but this may result in a higher cost.

- Can I send my child to After School club after an enrichment club?

Yes. There is a session from 4.10pm to 6pm at a cost of £10.

- Are there taster sessions for the clubs?

Due to time restraints and costs it is not possible to provide taster sessions for the clubs.

- Can I cancel the club if my child does not enjoy it?

This will be down to the club provider to agree – prices will be based on numbers attending.

- Can I have a sibling discount?

School run clubs are unable to provide this. If the club is run by an external provider please speak to them.

- Can I pay in instalments?

School run clubs are unable to accept instalments due to the financial commitments of the school. External providers may allow this, please speak with them directly.

- Is there a maximum number of clubs I can book my child on to?

No.

- Why do we only get one term of free clubs as a Pupil Premium provider?

The school receives money to support children across their time at school not just for clubs

- Can we use Childcare vouchers to pay for enrichment clubs?

No. The government has stipulated that these can only be used for wraparound care such as Breakfast and After School club.

- Why do we have to pay for choir and art club?

Choir is run by a musician who charges for his time. (Choir does not run in the Spring term). Art club will be run by an external provider who will be sharing her skills, knowledge and resources. If these clubs were free to families the school would have to fund them.
